Why study critical care nursing?

Our suite of courses includes the Critical Care Nursing (Intensive Care) and the Specialist Certificate in Critical Care Nursing. Both qualifications prepare you to work in a critical care environment by enhancing your knowledge and skills in high-pressure situations. You will develop the specialised knowledge needed to provide evidence-based care to patients with acute and complex illnesses or injuries.

The Specialist Certificate and the Graduate Certificate courses are delivered online, and will enhance your ability to understand and implement nursing interventions in the context of critical care.

These courses will advance your knowledge, understanding and clinical practice and you will gain skills that are highly sought after across high dependency units, intensive care units, emergency departments and retrieval services.

Why study at Melbourne?

Our teaching model for nursing specialty graduate certificates is unique to the University of Melbourne. In a workintegrated learning framework, you will undertake online study and face-to-face classes, as well as clinical supervision in your own hospital environment.

Who are these courses for?

Our courses are designed to be flexible, to suit the needs of currently practising nurses. As an applicant, you must be a a registered nurse. If applying for the Graduate Certificate, you must have the support of your employing hospital, which must be equipped to support you to complete your studies.

Entry requirements

To apply for the Critical Care Nursing courses, applicants are required to have:

- » Completed a Bachelor of Nursing or equivalent
- » Documented evidence of clinical practice within the preceding five years from the time of application
- » Nomination by your hospital to support you in undertaking the clinical component of the course
- » Current unrestricted registration as a Division 1 Registered Nurse with AHPRA or equivalent registration with an international health practitioner regulation agency.

Meeting these requirements does not guarantee selection. In ranking applications, the Selection Committee will consider:

- » Prior academic performance
- » Area of speciality practice and clinical experience
- » The University's English language requirements (equivalent to Academic Board performance band 6.5).
