The Graduate Diploma in Mental Health Nursing Practice has been designed collaboratively and with the guidance of a strategic reference group representing consumers, carers, industry leaders and government bodies. This is the only course in Australia to feature a postgraduate subject developed and delivered by a Consumer Academic.

Delivered online, this unique course gives students the opportunity to focus on specialities in aged mental health, first episode psychosis, child or youth mental health, or acute/adult mental health nursing. It is relevant to current practice and prepares you for a fulfilling career as a specialist mental health nurse.

What will You learn?

Upon completion of the course, graduates will:

- Appreciate from a consumer perspective how to apply theoretical, critical and practical knowledge and understand the implications of providing care
- Employ specialist nursing knowledge and skills to conduct comprehensive mental health assessment and develop a meaningful formulation
- » Exercise enhanced clinical judgment, decision-making and insight into specialist mental health nursing in pursuit of optimal outcomes for the person and family
- » Interrogate the concepts of risk and safety from a person-centred care perspective which considers social protections and the legal, moral and ethical principles to balance risk in recovery
- » Apply scientific judgement and contemporary evidence from a range of sources (consumerreported, clinician-observed and research-driven) to underpin the use of therapies, management of medication regimes and application of frameworks which inform mental health nursing care.

Course structure

Students enrolled in the Graduate Diploma in Mental Health Nursing Practice have the opportunity to progress into the Master of Advanced Nursing Practice midway through the graduate diploma (pending academic results).

Registered nurses who have completed a recognised mental health graduate year credentialed by the University or have previously completed the Master of Nursing Science (University of Melbourne), can apply for advanced standing of up to 25 credit points.

Entry requirements

To apply for this course, applications are required to have:

- » Bachelor of Nursing (or equivalent training)
- » Current unrestricted registration with AHPRA
- » Current employment and clinical support in a mental health specialty area; and
- » Satisfy the University's English language requirements (equivalent to Academic Board performance band 6.5).

In ranking applications, the Selection Committee will consider:

- » Prior academic performance
- » Area of specialty practice and clinical experience
