Students enrolled in the Graduate Diploma in Mental Health Nursing Practice have the opportunity to progress into the Master of Advanced Nursing Practice midway through the graduate diploma (pending academic results).

Registered nurses who have completed a recognised mental health graduate year credentialed by the University or have previously completed the Master of Nursing Science (University of Melbourne), can apply for advanced standing of up to 25 credit points.

Entry requirements

To apply for this course, applicants are required to have:

- A Bachelor of Nursing (or equivalent training)
- Current unrestricted registration with AHPRA
- Current employment and clinical support in a mental health specialty area; and
- Satisfy the University's English language requirements (equivalent to Academic Board performance band 7.0).
