Who are these courses for?

These courses are for professionals seeking a world-recognised, highly respected qualification that will open up global career pathways and enhance their opportunities in the private or public sector.

There are a range of flexible study options to suit both law and non-law graduates, and which provide pathways into further study:

LLM (Global Competition and Consumer Law)

Open to law graduates, comprises eight subjects and can be completed part time over two years.

Master of Global Competition and Consumer Law

Open to non-law graduates, such as economists, comprises eight subjects and can be completed part time over two years.

Graduate Diploma (Global Competition and Consumer Law)

A pathway course into further studies in Global Competition and Consumer Law, for law and non-law graduates, comprises four subjects.

Specialist Certificate in Global Competition Law

A stand-alone or pathway course into further studies in Global Competition and Consumer Law for law and non-law graduates, comprises two subjects.

What will I learn?

On successful completion of these programs, you will have advanced expertise and practical skills in global competition and consumer law, including in relation to:

- Economic theories, policies, principles and methods that underpin and influence policy and law in this area
- Legal rules in major jurisdictions around the world – particularly the United States, European Union, and parts of the Asia-Pacific region
- Institutions that develop, administer and enforce competition and consumer policy and law
- Challenges that arise in enforcing and securing compliance with competition and consumer law
- Contemporary international debates relating to the reform of competition and consumer policy, law and enforcement and institutional design and effectiveness.
